Notes: It may not be exact, there are some jazzy passing chords in there, but it should be close enough to be useful to someone playing on an "open-mic night" in a noisy club.

Bm/C# is "B minor over C-sharp", a B minor chord with a C-sharp in the bass.

Likewise, D/G is "D over G", a D major chord with a G in the bass, and D/F# is "D over F-sharp", a D major chord with an F-sharp in the bass. A simplified version of the song could be obtained by substituting any above chord on the left with those to the right of it;

G could be substituted for Gmaj7, A for A13, Bm for Bm9 or Bm/C#, etc.
